Policy

All Catholic schools will plan for and provide staff and students with contemporary ICT resources to enhance teaching, learning and administration.

Rationale

Information and Communication Technologies (ICTs) are an ubiquitous aspect of daily life.

In schools, ICTs allow *'teachers and students to access specialised materials well beyond textbooks, in multiple formats, with little time and space constraints'* (OECD, 2015).

It is therefore essential that as part of the TCS mission of academic success for all students within a distinctly Catholic environment, Catholic schools enable educators and students to become discerning individuals, capable of safely navigating the world of digital information, and are readily able to evaluate and adopt contemporary and emerging technologies to meet their personal, professional and educational needs.

Actions

- Schools will develop Technology and eLearning plans that include both short and long-term goals and targets for using contemporary and emerging ICTs in teaching, learning and administration.
- Schools will ensure all students have access to high-quality ICTs.
- Schools will prioritise the effective use of ICTs in teaching practices to accelerate student learning as the responsibility of all staff.
- Schools will plan for and facilitate infrastructure upgrades, equipment replacement and professional development of all staff to ensure equitable access and benefit for all users of ICT.
- Toowoomba Catholic Schools Office will provide specialist support to lead and support schools in implementing their Technology and eLearning plans.
- Toowoomba Catholic Schools Office will plan for and facilitate the ongoing development and upgrading of system-wide ICT infrastructure and equipment to support teaching, learning and administration.
